

4.0 PLAN ADOPTION

As the final step in updating the mitigation plan, Wood County followed the formal process for state review, federal approval, and local adoption. This section describes that process and includes all dates relevant to plan approval, adoption, and expiration. Adoption resolutions from all jurisdictions are also included.

4.1 STATE REVIEW AND FEDERAL PLAN APPROVAL

After extensive review by stakeholders and the community, the Wood County All-Hazard Multi-Jurisdictional Mitigation Plan was submitted to the Ohio Emergency Management Agency on July 12, 2018. The Contractor and EMA incorporated Ohio EMA's recommended revisions and prepared the plan for submission to the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

The plan was submitted to FEMA on **DATE**. Upon receipt of conditional approval from FEMA, Wood County EMA began to pursue adoption by the jurisdictions.

4.2 LOCAL ADOPTION

The local plan adoption process began upon receipt of conditional plan approval from FEMA. Wood County was the first jurisdiction to formally adopted the plan on behalf of the county as a jurisdiction itself, and on behalf of Bloom, Center, Freedom, Grand Rapids, Henry, Jackson, Liberty, Milton, Montgomery, Perry, Plain, Portage, Troy, Washington, Webster, and Weston Townships. All twenty-one incorporated jurisdictions were asked to formally adopt the plan through legislation as well. Lake, Middleton and Perrysburg Townships were also asked to adopt the plan to facilitate mitigation efforts in the community development efforts taking place in their jurisdictions.

Sample legislation was provided to each jurisdiction to assist in this process. A complete list of plan adoptions by jurisdiction is provided in table 4-1. Adoption resolutions from each jurisdiction are also attached to this section.

The process to maintain the plan will be ongoing throughout the five-year period, as explained in section 1.0 The Planning Process.
